April 27, 2016

- Members of Fight Back Pittsburgh mobilized to confront GOP Donald Trump's visit to Pittsburgh on April 13th. Hundreds of Fight Back Pittsburgh members converged at Soldiers and Sailors Hall in Oakland and at the David Lawrence Convention Center to clearly show that Donald Trump's racism and Islamophobia are not welcome in Pittsburgh.
- On April 14, members of Fight Back Pittsburgh mobilized to support the Fight for \$15 Global Day of Action. In addition to supporting fast food and hospital workers in outreach and turnout for the events, Fight Back Pittsburgh activists served as marshals during the major action.
- Fight Back Pittsburgh held our second 'Labor History Tour of Pittsburgh on Saturday, April 23rd. The tour, which was led by Local 3657 retiree Howard Scott, made stops at key labor history sites around Pittsburgh including the Homestead Works Pump House, Edgar Thompson Works, the Great Rail Strike of 1877, and the founding locations of the AFL, the CIO, and the AFL-CIO.
- On May 1, Fight Back Pittsburgh will hold our first (annual?!) May Day Picnic starting at 4pm at the Vietnam Veterans Pavilion in Schenley Park. The event had been scheduled to start at 3pm but when LCLAA announced plans to start its march at 3pm, the start time was pushed back to 4pm to minimize any scheduling conflicts.
- Fight Back Pittsburgh is mobilizing for a major protest outside of the meeting of the American Legislative Exchange Council (ALEC) at the Omni-William Penn on May 5-6. The major publicly announced rally is at 12noon on May 6th in Mellon Square Park.
